 - Applying joint project proposals to state and central government funding agencies
 - Jointly organizing multidisciplinary conferences, guest lectures, workshops and any other HRD Training Programmes
 - > Joint investment for the development of prototype models related to research projects
 - Arranging of awareness camp about the activities of the institute at the College and its Branches in association with DEIC, DDRC, etc...

The primary objective of this MoU is to promote academic interaction and scientific temper among the students and faculty of the institutions herein.

NOW THEREFORE THIS MOU WITNESSETH AS FOLLOWS

1. Collaborative Research:-

 - to organize and participate in conferences, symposia, courses, workshops, exhibitions and other joint meetings of mutual interest;
 - c) to initiate joint training/education programs to raise competency in Applied Mathematics;
 - d) to undertake funded research projects jointly and share the funds allotted thereto according to such terms and conditions prescribed by funding agencies.

(ii) Exchange of academic materials:-

Each organization will exchange relevant materials pertaining to research, scientific advancements and library, on a regular basis as approved by both organizations on mutual discussion. Exchange of reference materials in libraries for research purpose will be encouraged.

(iii) Exchange of Academic / Technical staff :-

Both the parties agree to depute suitable academic/research students participate in Workshops/Seminars/ Conferences conducted in each institution and present papers and deliver lectures.

(iv) Visiting Research Fellows :-

Either organization may nominate one or more of its faculty/research students to visit the other organization for the purpose of advanced study or research, subject to the approval of the host organization.

2. Terms & Conditions of collaboration :-

- (i) The terms and conditions for each specific collaborative activity to be undertaken under this MoU shall be mutually discussed and agreed upon in writing, by exchange of letters, between the parties to this MoU.
- (ii) Any such letters or agreements entered into, as outlined above, shall form part and parcel of this MoU.
- (iii) This MoU is not contract creating any legal or financial commitments between the parties. Rather, it is designed to facilitate and develop a genuine and mutually beneficial academic exchange programs.

3. Confidentiality and IPR-Protection

(i) Both parties hereunder agree that any information disclosed by one party to the other shall be maintained as proprietary confidential information and will be disclosed only to the authorities as required in the relevant statutory regulations and to those persons in the recipient party's organization that has a need to know for purposes authorized by the relevant agreement. 

- b. Upkeep of cleanliness and hygiene of the temple and its surroundings with all necessary physical facilities.
- c. Setting up of and implementing a preventive maintenance system for all facilities by identifying the relevant assets, defining the requirements, schedules and standards.
- d. Identify capital assets that need to be procured and replaced, set specifications, source and arrange to procure the same at the most competitive rates.
- e. Draw up a comprehensive security system including hardware and software and deploy necessary manpower for implementing the system.
- f. Set specifications, source and arrange to procure all necessary consumables and equipment at competitive rates for above activities.
- g. Provide suitable training for all human resources deployed in the premises and continuously review their performance.
- h. All outsourced manpower expenses towards the above activities (other than those on the payroll of the temple) will be borne by SSN.
- i. SSN will raise an invoice through its institutions on VSI at mutually agreed rates once a month and the VSI will pay same within 30 days from the date of invoice.

SSN will deploy its resources in the SSN College of Engineering and SSN School of Management to carry out the activities in this memorandum.

PREAMBLE

This Memorandum of Understanding (the "MOU") is entered into by and between:

"FACULTY OF ELECTRONICS AND COMMUNICATION ENGINEERING", located at Sri Sivasubramaniya Nadar College of Engineering, Kalavakkam – 603 110, Chennai, India, represented by the HoD Prof. Dr. S.Radha, (hereinafter "FECE") and

(1) "FACULTY OF TECHNICAL SCIENCES - UNIVERSITY OF NOVI SAD", located at Trg Dositeja Obradovića 6, 21000 Novi Sad, Republic of Serbia represented by the Dean Prof. Dr Rade Doroslovački (hereinafter "FTN"),

FTN and FECE are referred to collectively, as "Parties", or individually as "Party".

The following arrangements will operate to evolve a partnership in the spirit of friendship and on the basis of equality and mutual benefit.

1. Purpose

The purpose of this MOU is to define the areas for academic and scientific cooperation in which the Parties desire to work together in the future for their mutual benefit to foster a collaborative framework between FTN and FECE

2. General Provisions

This MOU sets forth the intentions of the Parties for increased collaboration, cooperation and interaction and does not create any legally binding commitments. Any specific joint projects with legally binding obligations will be set in separate written arrangements.

Treatment of intellectual property rights developed through collaborations will be determined between the Parties through mutual consultation and separate written agreements on a case-by-case basis.

Participating staff and student involved in any activities under this MOU must adhere to the law of the

host countries and rules and regulations of the host institutions.

3. Scope

The Parties intend to explore cooperation prospects in the following areas:

- Exchange of faculty members, researchers, and students for lectures, visits, and implementation of other collaborative projects;
- Cooperative research projects to be carried out in selected fields agreed upon mutually;
- Exchange of publications and other academic research information of common interest, as availability and resources permit;
- Development of joint degree programs, special programs and/or internships;
- 5. Organization of events of common interest (including conferences, workshops etc.).

4. Costs

Costs related to any activities in the framework of prospective cooperation between the Parties will be negotiated on a case-by-case basis.

Both parties agree that details of the terms and conditions for implementing each and any of the above, including financial arrangements, shall be discussed and determined on a case-by-case basis, depending upon the availability of funds. It is mutually understood that securing funds to carry out any of the above should be the joint responsibility of both parties.

5. Obligations of the parties

The PARTIES undertake to create necessary conditions for realization of the AGREEMENT.

Contact person for this Agreement at the Faculty of Technical Sciences is Prof. Dr. Dejan Vukobratovic.

Contact persons for this Agreement at the Faculty of Electronics and Communication Engineering, SSN are Dr. Prabagarane Nagaradjane and Dr. Kishore R.

6. Other conditions

- Directions of co-operation and its form can be amended under the mutual agreement of the PARTIES.
- The present AGREEMENT does not impose on the PARTIES any financial and obligations according to the law.
- 3) The PARTIES undertake not to reduce the execution of the present AGREEMENT on cooperation to mere observance of requirements maintained in it, to strengthen business

contacts and to take all necessary measures for maintenance of comprehensive communications.

Dispute resolution

Any disputes arising under or in connection with this MOU which cannot be resolved by amicable discussions between the Parties shall be referred to the Directors/Rectors of the respective Parties or their nominees for resolution, or may be submitted to such alternative dispute resolution mechanism as may be agreed in writing between the Parties.

If the informal attempts at resolution are not successful, the Parties agree that all claims or actions, related to, or arising out of, activities described in this MOU or any Project Agreement shall be brought in the courts of the place where the defendant is habitually resident.

8. Duration

This MOU shall remain in force for a period of five (5) years commencing from the date of signing and may be reviewed by mutual consent by serving six months written notice to the other Party. Upon renewal the terms will have been agreed. New terms may be agreed as part of a renewed Understanding.

Both Parties reserve the right to terminate this Memorandum by either Party giving three months written notice to the other. Where such termination occurs, the provisions of this Memorandum shall continue to apply to ongoing activities until their completion.

And

UNIVERSITI TUNKU ABDUL RAHMAN, a private university registered under the Malaysian Private Higher Educational Institutions Act 1996, wholly owned by UTAR Education Foundation [Company No. 578227-M], and having its address at Jalan Universiti, Bandar Barat, 31900 Kampar, Perak, Malaysia hereinafter referred to as "UTAR" (which expression shall, wherever the context so admits, mean and include it successors, representatives and permitted assigns) represented by its President of the other Part.

Scope:

The objective of this MOU is to extend and strengthen the scientific exchange and cooperation of mutual value to the respective organizations. The MOU envisages the conduct of collaborative projects on scientific research and exchange programs between SSNCE and UTAR, more particularly in the field of Environmental Engineering. The primary objective of this MOU is to promote academic interaction and scientific temper among the students and faculty of the institutions herein.

NOW THEREFORE THIS MOU WITNESSETH AS FOLLOWS

1. COLLABORATIVE RESEARCH

It is agreed by the parties to initiate the following steps:-

a. To encourage collaborative research projects by individual scholars or faculty members or among related departments and to establish continuing interactions. The financial



aspects and other terms and conditions of such joint research projects will be finalized on mutual discussion and consent of the parties hereto.

- b. To organize and participate in conferences, symposia, courses, workshops, exhibitions and other joint meetings of mutual interest.
- To initiate joint training/education programs to raise competency in Environmental Engineering.
- d. To undertake funded research projects jointly and share the fund allotted thereto according to such terms and conditions prescribed by funding agencies.

2. EXCHANGE OF ACADEMIC MATERIALS

Each organization will exchange relevant materials pertaining to research, scientific advancements and library, on a regular basis as approved by both organizations on mutual discussion. Exchange of reference materials in libraries for research purpose will be encouraged.

3. STUDENT EXCHANGE

- a. Each organization may send students, either undergraduate or graduate, to the other organization in appropriate fields of study or for the purpose of advanced research on a reciprocal, non-degree basis.
- b. The exchange programme shall be three (3) students only for one semester/trimester exchange within one academic year.
- c. The sending organization is responsible for screening its applicants for the student exchange. The host organizations reserves the right to make a final judgment whether to accept the nominated students and to exclude students from restricted enrollment programs. Exchange students shall follow the rules, regulations and enrollment requirements of the host organization.
- d. Students participating in this exchange shall be exempted from paying tuition and academic fees to the host organization; however, they shall pay whatever fees are required of them by the sending organization in order to participate in the exchange programme.

e. The details of the arrangement for facilitating the student exchange programme shall be stipulated in a separate agreement.

4. STAFF EXCHANGE PROGRAMME

Both parties may explore the following categories related to staff exchange programme. The details of the arrangement for facilitating the staff exchange programme shall be stipulated in a separate agreement.

a. Exchange of Academic/Technical Staff

The two organizations may nominate their academic/technical staff to participate in an exchange programme for the purpose of lecturing in the other organisation on a reciprocal basis. The participant is subject to approval by the host organisation. The period of exchange programme shall be one semester/trimester. The host organization will provide an appropriate appointment, library and research facilities and other assistance as deems necessary. The sending organisation will also maintain its academic/technical staff on full salary during the period of the exchange. The host organisation will assist the visiting academic/technical staff in locating living accommodation if needed.

b. Visiting Academic/Technical Staff

In addition to the reciprocal exchanges, either organisation may invite faculty/technical members of the other organisation for the purpose of lecturing or consultation for a specified period of time, subject to the approval of the sending organisation. In such cases the host organization shall make appropriate funding arrangements to be agreed in advance.

c. Visiting Research Fellows

Either organisation may nominate one or more of its faculty/technical members to visit the other organisation for the purpose of advanced study or research, subject to the approval of the host organisation; in such cases, the sending organisation will provide the Research Fellow with normal salary based on its regulations. The host organisation will provide organisational courtesies, library and research facilities and an appropriate appointment.

5. CO-OPERATIVE RESEARCH

Co-operative research is to be encouraged as individual scholars or departments establish contact and develop mutual interests. The cost and conditions of such agreements will be negotiated individually.

6. CO-ORDINATION OF THE EXCHANGE

- Each organisation will designate a Liaison Officer to develop and co-ordinate the specific activities agreed upon.
- b. Through these officers, both party may initiate proposals for activities and specific details of any such activities will be set forth in a letter of agreement.

7. TERMS & CONDITIONS OF COLLABORATION

- a. The terms and conditions for each specific collaborative activity to be undertaken, under this MOU shall be mutually discussed and agreed upon in writing, by exchange of letters or agreement, between the parties to this MOU.
- Any such letters or agreements entered into, as outlined above, shall form part and parcel of this MOU.
- c. This MOU is not contract to create any legal or financial commitments between the parties. Rather, it is designed to facilitate and develop a genuine and mutually beneficial academic exchange programs.

8. CONFIDENTIALITY AND IPR-PROTECTION

a. Both parties hereunder agree that any information disclosed by one party to the other shall be maintained as proprietary confidential information and will be disclosed only to the authorities as required in the relevant statutory regulations and to those persons in the recipient party's organisation that has a need to know for purposes authorised by the relevant agreement. All such proprietary confidential information will be kept in confidence and the party receiving the confidential information agrees to prevent the disclosure to any other person or persons outside the organisation or any unauthorised person or persons except to the organisation authorised by either of the parties hereunder on need to know basis for the execution of the work.

- b. Both parties shall not file any application for seeking intellectual property rights (IPR) in its own name or in the name of its associates or any other person(s) on any matter relating to the information disclosed to each other under this MOU. However, they can seek intellectual property rights on joint names of the parties as mutually agreed on case to case basis.
- c. Intellectual property generated during the activities under the MOU shall be shared jointly. 

The financial aspects and other terms and conditions of such joint research projects will be finalized on mutual discussion and consent of the parties hereto;
 - b) to organize and participate in conferences, symposia, courses, workshops, exhibitions and other joint meetings of mutual interest;

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- to arrange for exchange of technical data and information relating to medical instruments, conformity assessment and standardization, ongoing researches in the field of Biomedical Engineering;
- d) to initiate joint training/education programs to raise competency in specialized engineering applications like telemedicine, neuroscience, biomechanics, medical devices and implants, advanced biosignals and image analyzing techniques, biosciences; and
- e) to undertake funded research projects jointly and share the funds allotted thereto according to such terms and conditions prescribed by funding agencies.
- f) To encourage deeper commitment and involvement of industries in supporting development of new programmes and courses for which there are sufficient demand in industry;
- g) To mobilize assistance from industries for training and placement of students.
- h) To promote Faculty Engineer interchange by creating provision for faculty to work in industry for short duration and by encouraging competent professionals from the industry to take up technical/research activities in the university for short duration through visiting faculty or Adjunct Professor Appointments.
- To arrange internships for the SSNCE students, for the purpose of hands on training, and product development, etc.,
- j) To mobilize necessary financial resources from the concerned industries to accomplish the above staged objectives.

All such proprietary confidential information will be kept in confidence and the party receiving the confidential information agrees to prevent the disclosure to any other person or persons outside the organization or any unauthorized person or persons except to the organization authorized by either of the parties hereunder on need to know the basis for the execution of the work.

The obligations that are created under this MoU on either party as well as through subsequent relevant agreements on either party shall be duly discharged during the term of the MoU and agreement and after their expiry/termination.

- (ii) Both parties shall not file any application for seeking intellectual property rights (IPR) in its own name or in the name of its associates or any other person(s) on any matter relating to the information disclosed to each other under this MoU where intellectual property is generated through collaborative activity. However, they can seek intellectual property rights on joint names of the parties as mutually agreed on case to case basis as described in sub clause (iii). In cases where collaborative activity is not taken up or no progress is envisaged, the intellectual property is deemed to reside with the disclosing party.
- (iii) Intellectual property generated during the activities under the MoU shall be shared jointly. The extent of ownership shall be decided mutually depending upon the relative intellectual inputs made by the parties. The expenditure incurred and to be incurred for the maintenance of IPR shall be borne by each party equally or in proportion to the extent of ownership as may be decided by the Steering Committee.

4. Publication

Publications, if any, in respect of the activity under this MoU shall be in the names of involved personnel from both the parties. In all publications (papers, reports, etc.,) it will be duly acknowledged that the work has been carried out by SSNCE and COMPANY under this MoU between the parties.

5. Duration of MoU:-







This MoU details the modalities and general conditions regarding collaboration between MACE and SSN for enhancing, within the country, the availability of highly qualified manpower in the area of civil engineering, infrastructure engineering, environmental and water resources engineering and other branches of civil engineering, technology and science:

- a) without any prejudice to the prevailing rules and regulations in MACE & SSN;
- without any disregard to any mechanism evolved and approved by the competent authorities under Government of India/State Government of Tamil Nadu;
- c) Without any disregard to the decisions of the Board of Directors of MACE & SSN;
- d) Without any disregard to the conditions of contract agreement entered between MACE and its client;
- e) Without any disregard to any statutory and regulatory authorities related to operations of SSN and MACE;
- f) SSN and MACE will exercise utmost care to preserve the confidentiality of all the relevant matters arising out of the joint efforts; and
- g) Other bodies in so far as such mechanism applies to MACE and/or SSN.

The areas of cooperation can be extended through mutual consent.

III. ARTICLE - II: SCOPE OF PROFESSIONAL INTERACTION

MACE and SSN shall encourage interaction between the MACE executives and SSN faculty members and students, ethically and professionally through the following arrangements, on mutual consent and approvals of both Parties as appropriate and subject to the compliance to the conditions of contract agreement entered between MACE and its client:

 Joint guidance of student projects in infrastructure engineering, civil engineering, structural engineering, geotechnical engineering, water management, environmental engineering, building science & technology, engineering geosciences and other areas

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- of mutual interest at SSN by MACE executives, scientists and faculty of SSN as per rules and regulations of both Parties
- ii) MACE shall render assistance to the Department of Civil Engineering by offering their expertise in fine-tuning the curriculum and syllabus by serving in the Board of studies of the department and also by serving a member of the Academic council of SSN. This will be decided by the Head of the Department of Civil Engineering as per the need from time to time
- The dedicated faculty on both sides (Parties) shall act as the consultant/outsourcer and Technical supporter to one another at all technical, administrative, management and R&D areas. However, the engagement of faculty/consultant/expert of SSN shall be subject to the approval of the client of MACE. MACE shall consider taking part in the teaching-learning process of SSN Department of Civil Engineering by handling few lectures pertaining to selected courses which will be decided by the Head of the Department of Civil Engineering of SSN from time to time, and, assist the faculty with the assignment problems as needed to make sure that the students are exposed to real-life problems relevant to the courses;
- iv) Human resources at both sides shall be strengthened by way of conducting workshops/lectures/study camps at regular intervals. Both Parties shall organize regular/routine training programme at various levels of technical and managerial manpower of all discipline at very nominal costs at their respective premises;
- v) Practical training of SSN students at MACE and vice-versa;
- vi) Participation of MACE executives in SSN research and technical programmes;
- vii) Participation of SSN faculty and students in MACE projects;
- MACE shall be allowed permission to conduct campus interviews and recruit students of SSN for employment if deemed fit and need for recruitment exists. MACE will freely engage the student manpower for any of their R&D activities at their works under various schemes like mini/major projects to benefits both sides equally, subject to the approval of the client of MACE. MACE shall consider eligible students of the undergraduate (UG) programme of the Department of Civil Engineering, SSN for internships and projects on a paid or non-paid basis as per the convenience of the company. The selection shall be made based on personal discussion with the students and reference from the faculty members on a case to case basis in consultation with the Head of the Department of Civil Engineering, SSN. MACE shall assist SSN by giving pre-placement training for the eligible UG students of the Department of Civil Engineering, SSN and equip the students with necessary skills to assist the students in getting placements, internships and development of entrepreneurial skills by making them industry ready;
- ix) MACE shall assist SSN in developing expertise of the faculty in taking up consultancy activities of the Department of Civil Engineering by linking the industry with the faculty members as needed, engaging the faculty members for their consultancy activities as per the need of MACE

- x) Guidance of student's internships, projects in MACE in the area of industrial infrastructure, agro, food and sustainable rural development, sustainable urbanisation, sustainability solutions, infrastructure engineering of national interest on mutually agreeable terms as listed below:
 - a. MACE shall assist the Department of Civil Engineering, SSN by guiding the final year student projects by involving the specialists from MACE and by attaching the students in the MACE projects. This is considered an industry-relevant attachment activity.
 - MACE shall consider involving our students and faculty of the Department of Civil
 Engineering in research-intensive projects of MACE on a case by case basis.

 MACE shall inform the Head of the Department whenever such opportunity arises;
 - c. If the outcome of a project related to product development, process, technology and design etc. which involves the matter of secrecy and concern with the security of the State and Country or for any other reasons, the same will not be allowed for publication/printing in any form such as electronic/verbal etc. However, normal research outcome that arises from joint projects which involve no secrecy/ security concerns may be allowed to be published after mutual concurrence and acceptance by both parties.
 - If the outcome of a project results in intellectual property, for which rights can be secured, it will be decided on a case to case basis;
 - e. Similarly, sharing of expenditure in securing such rights and income accrued through royalty etc. by the Parties under the law will be decided on a case to case basis after mutual consultation;
 - f. The conditions of contract agreement entered between MACE and its client shall govern, and in no circumstances, deviation or violation of the contract agreement entered between MACE and its client shall be entertained; and
 - g. MACE and SSN shall organize joint events such as conferences, workshops, guest lectures, career guidance sessions, seminars etc., on topics of interest in the areas of Civil Engineering at least once every semester. Webinar talks covering QC, safety, structural detailing etc. i.e. on topics of practical relevance. There shall be a faculty coordinator from SSN for each and every programme that is jointly organized. MACE shall also support SSN in organizing conferences related to Civil Engineering and allied fields in suggesting resource persons as and when needed by the Department of Civil Engineering. SSN shall extend the available infrastructure and other facilities to conduct the programmes.
 - h. MACE shall institute an award to encourage and appreciate the students and faculty of the Department of Civil Engineering annually. he award shall carry a certificate and a memento (please edit this as per your choice). The rules of evaluation for the award shall be decided by MACE from time to time.

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IV. ARTICLE - III: SHARING OF FACILITIES

- MACE and SSN shall make provisions to share their respective infrastructure, design office, R&D facilities in order to promote academic and research interaction in the areas of cooperation subject to approvals and availability;
- SSN students/faculty shall be responsible for the visa, travel and accommodation costs for availing the MACE overseas opportunities and facilities; and
- c) In the decision of sharing of facilities and in all other aspects like intellectual property rights, confidentiality, engagement of the third-party, liability, code of conduct, insurance, safety, security, etc., the conditions of contract agreement entered between MACE and its client shall govern, and in no circumstances, deviation or violation of the contract agreement entered between MACE and its client shall be entertained.

V. ARTICLE - IV: RENEWAL, TERMINATION AND AMENDMENT OF MoU

- This MoU shall be effective from the date of its approval by competent authorities of SSN and Board of Directors of MACE or other such authorities of MACE;
- The duration of this MoU shall be for a period of 3 (three) years from the date of effect. If not renewed or amended in writing the same shall be considered as expired or terminated;
- c) This MoU may be amended by mutual written agreement of the Parties at any time; and
- d) This MoU may be terminated at any time by any Party unilaterally without assigning any whatsoever reasons or without approval of the other Party upon 15 (Fifteen) days prior written notice to the other Party intimating the termination of the MoU.

VI. ARTICLE - V: Intellectual Property Rights (IPR)

Rights regarding publications, patents, royalty, ownership of software/ design/product developed etc. under the scope of this MoU shall be decided by both Parties by mutual consent.

VII. ARTICLE - VI: JURISDICTION

All matters, queries, disputes or differences, whatsoever, arising between the Parties touching the construction, meaning, operation or effect of this MoU or out of or relating to this MoU or breach thereof shall be mutually discussed between the Parties and settled or else settled through Arbitration in accordance with the relevant Arbitration Act in force at such time.

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English shall be the Language in the Arbitration. The Arbitration award shall be binding on both Parties. Place of Arbitration would be in Chennai. In all matters concerning this MoU, requiring judicial intervention, Chennai courts alone will have jurisdiction.

VIII. ARTICLE - VII: CONFIDENTIALITY

SSN and MACE will exercise utmost care to preserve confidentiality of all the relevant matters arising out of the joint efforts. During the tenure of the MoU, all information to be shared must be indicated as "confidential" or "non-confidential". Both MACE and SSN will maintain confidentiality and prevent disclosure of all the information designated as "confidential" except by mutual consent and agreement.

IX. ARTICLE - VIII: OTHER TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- a) Compliance: MACE enters contracts with its clients for rendering consulting services. MACE performance and other obligations are bound by stipulations mentioned in MACE client's contract. Hence, MACE obligation towards this MoU is subject to the provisions of MACE contract, and interpretation of MACE in this matter shall be final. Any research, patent, commercial agreements, royalty, ownership, intellectual property rights including publishing results and outcome or such matters between MACE and SSN are subject to compliance and provisions of the contract undertaken by the respective Party with their client or project owner and to be decided on the case-to-case basis based on the approval of the client.
- b) Disclaimer: This MoU does not compel or force any Party either fully or partly to perform a function or fulfil any commitment agreed upon on best interests. All the agreements made between the Parties are only endeavours and not in any way mandatory. It is further made abundantly clear that no third-party mediation or Arbitration is earnest or warranted unless situation demand so. The Parties shall, however, meet periodically in the manner agreed to review the MoU and modify the scope of works if any, depending on the special demands and needs, arising then and there. Also, it is explicitly made clear that the MoU shall not be used by SSN in whatsoever manner for branding and marketing purposes other than the purpose it is intended for.
- c) Non-Exclusivity: The relationship of the Parties under this MoU shall be non-exclusive and both Parties, including their affiliates, subsidiaries and divisions, are free to pursue other agreements or collaborations of any kind. However, when entering into a particular research agreement, the participants may agree to limit each Party's right to collaborate with others on that subject.
- d) No Partnership or agent relationship: Nothing in this MoU shall be construed to make either Party a partner, an agent or legal representative of the other for any purpose.

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e) Assignment: It is understood by the Parties herein, this MoU is based on the professional competence and expertise of each Party, and hence neither Party shall transfer or assign this MoU, or rights or obligations arising hereunder, either wholly or in part, to any third party.

f) Signed in duplicate: This MoU is executed in duplicate with each copy being an official

version of the MoU and having equal legal validity.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING (MoU)

BETWEEN

Sri Sivasubramaniya Nadar College of Engineering (SSNCE)

Chennai

AND

Indian Institute of Information Technology Una (IIITU) Himachal Pradesh

This Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) is entered into on 02, September 2021 by and between:

Sri Sivasubramaniya Nadar College of Engineering (SSNCE), Chennai (hereinafter referred to as "SSNCE") an autonomous Institution affiliated to Anna University, Chennai, being the First Party

AND

The Indian Institute of Information Technology Una (IIITU), Himachal Pradesh, established by the Ministry of Education, Government of India, by an Act of Parliament No. 23 of 2017, having its office at Saloh, Una District, Himachal Pradesh, an Institute of National Importance (hereinafter referred to as IIITU), being the Second Party.

1. OBJECTIVES OF THE MoU

To facilitate wide range of interactions between IIITU and SSNCE, and thereby lend greater strength to the activities of mutual interest aimed at serving the society through the technology and innovations in various domains.

2. AREAS OF COLLABORATION

Principal technical area of collaboration between IIITU and SSNCE will be in the domains of Computer Networks, Security, Big Data, Analytics, IoT, and machine learning, but not limited to.

The bilateral collaboration would capitalize on the complementary strengths of IIITU and SSNCE, for achieving the goal of technology innovations in the above mentioned domains.

3. PROPOSED MODES OF COLLABORATION

IIITU and SSNCE propose to collaborate through the following:

a. Co-operation in areas of research, education, policy inputs and outreach for development and dissemination of efficient technologies for sustainable use and rejuvenation of natural resources.

- b. Collaborative projects based on individual or joint funding in areas of mutual interest. These would also include targeted, short term requests from one partner to other(s) to address specific issues outside its area of strength but within the combined domain of both the partners.
- c. Conferencing, consulting, and wide-ranging intellectual exchanges to build knowledge consortia, which can offer technology based innovative and workable solutions and provide a roadmap for sustainable development of state/nation.
- d. Organizing joint conferences and workshops.
- e. Supervising UG / PG / PhD students for their projects and thesis work.
- f. Writing joint projects to national and/or international funding agencies and executing joint consultancy services.
- g. Exchange of personnel including students, faculty members, and technical staff for the purpose of greater integration, capacity building, and facilitating a close-knit working arrangement wherever needed by the nature of task in hand.
- h. Any other appropriate mode of interaction agreed upon between IIITU and SSNCE.
- Appropriate written agreements specific to particular collaborative works will be made as and when necessary.

4. IP GOVERNANCE FRAMEWORK

IIITU and SSNCE will jointly decide in connection to background IP, Project IP, Profit sharing, global access, etc., based on the following principles:

- a. It is the responsibility of both IIITU and SSNCE to protect the New Intellectual Property (New IP).
- b. The New IP shall not be assigned or transferred to any third party directly or indirectly.
- c. The provisions of IP governance will be specifically stated as, legally binding on IIITU and SSNCE.
- d. Intellectual Property Rights for all deliverables through collaboration including but not limited to source code, model, model data, dataset, schematics, test reports, documentation, etc., shall rest with both IIITU and SSNCE.
- e. The cost of patent application filing, including the fees to be paid to IP granting bodies and the Professional fees of consultants engaged primarily for filing patents, shall be borne by both IIITU and SSNCE equally. IIITU shall support patent filing and enable

registration of the Intellectual Properties with appropriate agencies. IIITU may take the opinion of experts, seek help and guidance from the professionals of IP patenting service providers by paying the professional fee, besides the applicable fee fixed by the Govt., at various stages of application filing. Such expenses shall be met from the 'Overhead' amount payable to the Institute by the sponsor of the project. The revenue from the patents granted due to collaborative works, will be shared equally among the Institutes of invention and inventors from IIITU and SSNCE, viz., 30% to IIITU, 30% to SSNCE, 20% to inventor of IIITU, and 20% to inventor of SSNCE or the extant policy of IP revenue sharing of the respective institutes which is in vogue from time to time.

- f. Both IIITU and SSNCE shall not disclose project reference, client listings or financial statement filings or disclose the existence of this Agreement, nor any of its details or the existence of the relationship created by this Agreement to any third party.
- g. IIITU and SSNCE with best of their efforts will ensure there is no willful violation of design or patent rights. However, portions of the collaborative work can be used for research purposes jointly by the inventors of both the institutes. Sharing of authorship in publications arising out of or in connection with joint activities shall be with mutual consent of each other
- h. Based on this MoU, if any patent is filed, IIITU and SSNCE will still continue to be the Institutes of invention along with the inventors mentioned in the patent filing application till it is processed upto 'grant' stage, even if the inventors move to their parent Institute or relocate to different Institute for their employment.
- Once the patent filling process is initiated by the Inventing Institutes, it is the
 responsibility of the Inventing Institutes to complete the process till 'grant' stage,
 irrespective of the movement of the inventors to other Institutes on any circumstances.
- j. Any fees arising out in future with reference to the filed application for patent shall be borne by the Institutes of Invention, as per the Clause 4(e) of this MoU.

5. CONFIDENTIALITY

a. Individual faculty involved at IIITU and SSNCE agree to hold in confidence all information/data designated by the parties as being confidential which is obtained from either party or created during the performance of the MoU and will not disclose the same to any third party without written consent of the other party. b. The above confidential clause under this MoU excludes information/data possessed by either party before entering into this MoU or independently developed and/or information already available through public domain, or information which is required to be disclosed by any law or disclosure of such information is directed by a court, tribunal or any competent authority.

6. TERM AND TERMINATIONS

- a. The collaboration will be coordinated by designated persons from the two Institutions. For all issues related to finances, man-power and space, and other infrastructure relevant for the collaboration, the designated individuals from both institutes would obtain necessary approvals and sanctions.
- b. This MoU shall be valid for five (05) years unless extended by mutual consent of both the Parties. A Party willing to extend the MoU shall give a written notice of its intention to extend, at least 60 days prior to the expiry of this MoU, which may be accepted by the other Party within a period of 30 days from the receipt of such notice.
- c. This MoU may be amended or terminated by mutual written agreement of the parties at any time.
- d. Either party shall have the right to terminate this MoU with 60 days prior written notice to other party.
- e. The termination of the MoU whether mutual or unilateral, shall not affect obligations as of the participant under any Research Agreement. Confidentiality clause obligation as referenced in Clause 5 shall survive such termination

7. DISPUTE SETTLEMENT

Any disputes arising out of the interpretation or implementation of the MoU shall be settled amicably by negotiation and consultation between parties.

8. SCOPE OF THIS MoU

a. This MoU shall cover the project titled, "Nagarik Rog Pratirakshak: Unified Smart Immunization Coverage Monitoring and Analysis (UniSICMA)" a collaborative research project funded by BIRAC, DBT, GoI, the first phase of which was executed by both IIITU and SSNCE with Prof. S. Selvakumar and Prof. R. Kanchana as the respective collaborators from Feb 2019 by the sanction No. BT/IDIA0158/04/17 dated 14, Jan.'19 and will be successfully completed in 30, Sept. 2021.

- b. This MoU shall also cover any other projects to be submitted in future by both the collaborators and/or both the Institutes.
- c. The signed MoU signifies only a strong intent and commitment towards the goals specified in the document. Both the institutes will have to follow all the rules/regulations and obtain appropriate sanctions for implementing all the joint activities.

9. COODINATION COMMITTEE

The following will constitute the Coordination Committee to execute, monitor, and review the collaborative program between IIITU and SSNCE:

- a. Prof. S. Selvakumar, Director, IIITU
- b. Dr. R. Kanchana, Associate Professor, Department of CSE, SSNCE
